Answer :: Create a field called "Last Tuesday" and make the formula:

=Begin-(WEEKDAY(Begin,1))+3

Filter your view so that it shows only those tasks where that date is less than or equal to 14 days from today.

Answer :: In the event handler for the button click event, be sure to call the .DataBind method on the datagrid.

To retrieve the values from within controls in template columns, create a handler for the OnItemDataBound event, then find the controls by ID for each row.

One bit of advice - make sure you check the Item.ItemType. You wont find the control you're looking for if the ItemType is a Header or Footer. [Read More](#)

how can I do that?

Answer :: You can create an Annoucement list and name it as news. Now you can add web part on page you want to display these news by selecting browse on add web part link. Select the list that you have created and drag to zone where you what news to be displayed. [Read More](#)

I'm an Administrator for dozens of portal sites, and when an employee leaves I need a way to remove them from the member list on every site. Isn't there a more efficient way than visiting each individual site to update the member list?

Answer :: The site should have been set up to inherit parent site permissions. The site should have been set up using group-based permissions. That way, if a person joins or leaves, you just delete the user from your parent site and/or whatever group(s) they belong to, and you are done.

Unfortunately, this is probably not the case. You could probably slowly and carefully move from a user-based permissions schema to a group-based one, by determining what types of people have access to which lists and sites, and creating a group for each distinct pool of users.

By adding those users to a group, and granting that group the same permissions as that user, you can slowly take away the access from that user (as they are now part of the group that has the same access, the users shouldn't notice any permissions changes).

Depending on how many users you have, and groups, and sites, and lists, conversion may not be worth the trouble, or it may be, I dunno.

Open the view in Share Point Designer. Right-click the list view, and convert to XSLT. Mouse over the column you want to modify until you get the modify width cursor (looks like a double arrow, like this <---->). Single click, and drag the column until it is as wide as you need it. Save.

I have a list in sharepoint 07 which also contains a calculated column based on cost per usage. column x * column y = total. I have also identified a cost code to each record. I'd like to do a running sum of the totals by cost code. If it were a spreadsheet, I could just sum on the total column. But this is a list, which is grouped by cost code. Is there a way to do a final sum of the total column by cost code?

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What I want to do is calculate the grand totals by division.

Answer :: You will need to create a custom view and then edit the view in Sharepoint Designer. You will right-click the view and convert to XSLT, and have XSLT do the calculations for you. You will need to know XSLT to accomplish this. [Read More](#)

ok, ill explain first what i have.

- i made my task list. then i made the today column (and later deleted it). then i made a "view until" calculated column. in this column i have '= [Today]+13'

- i also made a column named "Time Calculator" that has this formula '=IF(Entered+13>Today,"yes","no")'

- then what i did was made a new view so that it filters if the View Until column is greater than or equal to [Today] AND if Time Calculator is greater than or equal to Yes, it will show only those.

- ok now what i need. although this works, it isnt exactly what i need. as you can see, it just hides them after 14 days. what i want is for it to hide them every second tuesday. so every second tuesday, it will get rid of th old ones and there is a brand new list.

- im not sure if this makes sense....its sort of hard to explain what i want, but someone i work with said that there is no formula that will repeat itself every 2 weeks...so am i doomed to this? :)

Answer :: Why do you have to be so difficult? Just kidding, here is the solution:

Create a calculated field called secondtuesday with the formula:

We are using SharePoint to post and store word files for a new project we are working on. My boss has asked for a list of those posted thus far. I exported the list from Sharepoint to MS Excel and unlinked it but the file names still remain as hyperlinks and everytime we click on one it opens the MS Word file.

- Can anyone tell me how to stop them being hyperlinks? I just need a plain old list at this point!

- Please help!

Answer :: Here are two approaches you can use in Excel:

- 1) Select and copy the entire list range
- 2) Go to a new worksheet
- 3) Right click select 'paste special'
- 4) Paste values
- 5) The links should be gone. . . if not . . .

- 2) Edit, Links, Break Link(s) [Read More](#)

[so, i have my task list and it works great. the only problem i am having is...i want to make it so that it automatically deletes items after a certain period of time \(either 2 weeks or a month, havent decided yet\).](#)

Answer :: Without developing a new SharePoint Application, you can sort-of make a work-around.

In your task list, create a new field called 'Expiration' and make it a date/time. Or, create a field called 'TwoWeeks' and make it a calculated field, and the calculation will be "=[Start Date]+13".

Create a new view that shows all items where the date in your new field is less than today. You will have to go into SharePoint Designer (or FrontPage) to create this custom view, unless you know the 'today' trick. See the URL in my source to get the 'today' trick.

This new view will give you a list of all of the expired tasks, and you can just click through them and delete the ones that have expired. [Read More](#)

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Export your issues list into Excel. Make SURE you export using a view that shows ALL records (not just where current=yes).

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Right-click anywhere in the Excel, and select List -> unsynchronize.

Import the excel file into SharePoint as a brand-new list.

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Tweak, repeat until you have something you like.
